Machinery, pressure vessel, and exhaust gas installations

The following regulations always apply to all types of machines and systems, including robots, whether stationary or mobile, controlled or autonomously operated.

5.7.1

Pressurized and liquefied gas installations (extract)

Deutsche Messe must be notified in writing of where gases will be used.

The "Technical Rules for Liquefied Gas" DVFG-TRF 2012 as well as the DGUV regulation 80 "Use of Liquefied Gas" must be observed for the installation and operation of gas-carrying lines and system parts. Installation may only be carried out by demonstrably competent persons and must be documented.

Main gas shut-off devices must be accessible and marked.

Deutsche Messe must be notified in writing of where gases will be used.

The "Technical Rules for Liquefied Gas" DVFG-TRF 2021 as well as the DGUV regulation 80 "Use of Liquefied Gas" must be observed for the installation and operation of gas-carrying lines and system parts. Installation may only be carried out by demonstrably competent persons and must be documented.

Main gas shut-off devices must be accessible and marked.

Laser systems with a radiation of class 3R or higher in machines or exhibits are generally subject to approval.

5.10

High-frequency equipment, radio communication systems, electromagnetic compatibility, harmonic components (extract)

[...]

The operation of high-frequency equipment and radio communications is permitted only if the equipment complies with the BGI Code on Communication Systems and the Code on the Electromagnetic Compatibility of Equipment (EMVG).

Deploying the LTE standard may lead to interference for wireless microphones and monitoring systems operating in the 790 to 862 MHz range.

High-frequency equipment, radio communication systems, electromagnetic compatibility, harmonic components (extract)

The operation of high-frequency equipment and radio communications is permitted only if the equipment complies with the Telecommunications Act and the Code on the Electromagnetic Compatibility of Equipment (EMVG).

The operation of wireless microphone and monitor systems is registration-free in the frequency ranges between 470-608 MHz, 614-698 MHz, 823-832 MHz, 863-865 MHz and 1785-1805 MHz.

**5.14
Animals**

The introduction of animals into event areas is subject to notification and must be carried out in compliance with hygiene regulations, animal welfare and the evacuation of people and animals.

An evacuation plan must be coordinated with Deutsche Messe AG.

Veterinary and official notification and approval requirements remain unaffected by this.

Animals should only be brought in if the topic of animals is part of the event content.

| <p>3.4</p> | <p>3.4</p> <p>Animals, with the exception of assistance dogs, are prohibited unless Deutsche Messe AG has given its express consent, possibly subject to conditions. Deutsche Messe AG is also entitled to prohibit the carrying of certain items or make this dependent on the fulfillment of certain conditions as a general rule or in individual cases. Section 5.3 of the House Regulations remains unaffected hereby.</p> |
| <p>8.4</p> <p>The exhibition complex is subject to a ban on smoking in all enclosed areas, including the exhibition halls. Designated smoking zones are clearly marked as such.</p> | <p>8.4</p> <p>Any form of smoking (including e-cigarettes, for example) is prohibited within the exhibition grounds and in all enclosed areas, including the halls, except in specially designated smoking areas.</p> |
| <p>-</p> <p>-</p> | <p>8.5</p> <p>The consumption of narcotics and cannabis is prohibited.</p> |
| <p>-</p> <p>-</p> | <p>8.6</p> <p>The carrying of extremist, racist and xenophobic materials is prohibited.</p> |
| <p>-</p> <p>-</p> | <p>8.7</p> <p>Overnight stays on the exhibition grounds are not permitted without the prior written consent of Deutsche Messe AG.</p> |
| <p>-</p> <p>-</p> | <p>8.8</p> <p>The use of power points (electricity) is prohibited. Exceptions are either designated (e.g. in communication zones) or require the prior written consent of Deutsche Messe AG.</p> |
| <p>9.1</p> <p>All photographic, video and online productions made at the exhibition complex for commercial purposes require prior written approval from Deutsche Messe AG.</p> | <p>9.1</p> <p>Photographic, film and online productions for commercial purposes require the prior written consent of Deutsche Messe AG. This does not apply to such productions realized on their own stand by exhibitors themselves or by third parties commissioned by them. Section 8.3 of these House and Grounds Regulations remains unaffected hereby.</p> |
